● PROGRAMS CONT.



- **Chosen Pathways (A)** – young adults enjoy a summer internship learning how they can choose a positive life path through the Arts
- **Education Advocacy Coalition (Ed)** – community stakeholders come together to address policy concerns around education and student success
- **Student Advocates for Education (Ed)** – SAFE volunteers advocate for students in pre-K through 5th grade to address the root causes of certain behaviors to help kids avoid suspension and detention
- **Parent Café (Ed)** – monthly workshops designed for school-age children cover topics such as IEPs, trauma-informed care, social-emotional and learning
- **Food & Justice Fellowship (CW)** – community members participate in several modules to acquaint themselves with the work needed to improve a food system: equity & justice, growing food & STEM, business & entrepreneurship
- **Community Speak Outs (POL)** – listening sessions provide space for community members to share what systemic changes they want to see in North County
- **Enrichment Town Halls (CW, Ed, A)** – team members and guest speakers will discuss various topics such as safety, credit, budgeting, nutrition, and student needs
